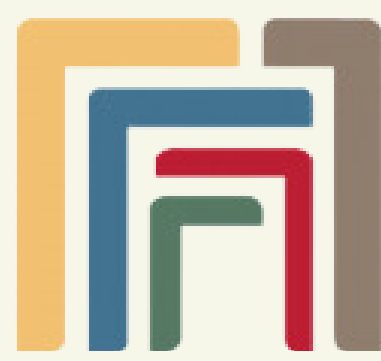




UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS

Wearing uniform is a sign of being willing to cooperate with our agreed school expectations. Pupils wearing uniform are communicating that they respect our values and want to work together to make our school the best it can be for everyone. Uniform communicates that no-one is more important in our school because they can afford more expensive clothes.

Pupils should wear:

- School tie and white shirt
- Black trousers or skirt
- Black footwear
- Pupils may choose to wear black school jumper or cardigan



Prefects should:

- Wear school blazer
- Be an example of excellent uniform

Physical Education

- Plain t-shirt – white or royal blue
- Black shorts / sports trousers
- Plain black or grey jumper or hoodie.
- Waterproof jacket.
- Clean shoes for indoor. Outdoor trainers or football boots for outdoor.



Pupils must not wear:

- Leggings, sportswear, branded clothes, round neck jumpers, hoodies, white or coloured footwear.
- Outdoor clothing must be removed in class.

We are aware of a small number of pupils who for a range of reasons are unable to wear uniform. Teachers are aware of these pupils and will not discuss uniform with them.
